On the day of your test, please bring a valid credit card to pay the online testing center and a valid picture id.








Checking for Prohibited Materials

The following are prohibited at the test site:

	Smoking and the use of all tobacco products
	Visitors , including relatives, children, and friends
	Weapons of any kind

The examinee may bring into the testing room **only a pen or pencil and eraser**.

As the examinee enters the test site, ensure that he or she does not have any of the following prohibited materials:

	Cell phones (possession or use of)
	Electronic devices and media , such as PDAs, pagers, computers, audiotapes, CDs, photographic or recording devices, removable storage devices, calculator watches, clocks or watches with alarms, spellcheckers, etc.
	Calculators and calculator manuals
	Handwritten or printed materials , such as dictionaries, notebooks, scratch paper, textbooks, etc.
	Packages and totes of any kind, such as backpacks, briefcases, etc.
	Food and drink
	Unauthorized aids , such as slide rules, rulers, translation aids, highlighters, etc.

If an examinee has any of the prohibited materials listed above, do the following:

- Encourage the examinee to return any prohibited materials to his or her car before testing.
- If that is not possible, have the examinee leave these materials in a designated area away from the workstation. Ask the examinee to turn off or silence his or her cell phone if left in this area.
- Do not allow the examinee to access these materials during the test.
